## GENERAL PUBLIC ORDER REGARDING COVID-19 VIRUS PUBLIC EMERGENCY—GRAND JURY PROCEEDINGS

On March 16, 2020, the court issued amended General Order 20-2. Among other things, it continued all grand jury proceedings to a date after May 1, 2020. On April 23, 2020, the court updated that order in General Order 20-9, extending the closure of the building and the adjournment of in-person court hearings to at least June 1, 2020. General Order 20-9 did not address grand jury proceedings.

The court has continued to monitor the status of the COVID-19 pandemic in the United States, and specifically in the Eastern District of Wisconsin. The court has continued to work closely with agencies in the federal building and various stakeholders and has consulted orders and guidance issued by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, Governor Tony Evers, the Centers for Disease Control and the World Health Organization, as well as public health officials in the Milwaukee area. Based on the information available to date, including the estimated number of persons infected currently with COVID-19 and the number of cases projected to occur in the immediate future, the court makes the following findings:

- 1.) The gatherings of people in close proximity to one another that occur during court operations presents substantial health risks to the public;
- 2.) It is not yet possible to summon grand jurors to meet in the federal building as they have in the past without creating substantial and unacceptable health risks, specifically, the danger of grand jurors, prosecutors or court staff becoming infected with COVID-19;
- 3.) While the court and the United States Attorney are exploring options, the court has not yet found an option that will allow grand juries to safely meet in other ways and still comply with the requirements of Fed. R. Crim. P. 6;
- 4.) The health risks described above may be significantly mitigated by temporarily suspending grand jury proceedings; and
- 5.) Good cause exists to continue temporary suspension of grand jury proceedings.

Based on these findings, the court **ORDERS** that the provision of General Order 20-2 that continued grand jury proceedings to a date after May 1, 2020 is **EXTENDED** to continue grand jury proceedings to a date after **June 1**, **2020**.

The court **ORDERS** that it will continue to work with the U.S. Attorney and court staff to explore options for safely conducting grand jury proceedings.

The court **ORDERS** that if appropriate, the court may vacate or amend

this order prior to June 1, 2020. If necessary, the court may extend the order beyond June 1, 2020.
