ORDER AMENDING JUROR SELECTION PLAN

IT IS ORDERED that effective this date, the Juror Selection Plan of this court is amended by:

Striking the words, "grand and" in Section 11.6, to read as follows:

11.6 DISCLOSURE OF JUROR'S NAMES AND QUESTIONNAIRES

The lists of current ~~grand and~~ petit jury arrays and the juror questionnaires shall be available for inspection at the Clerk's office to the parties and public, provided that the Court may order the names and addresses to be kept confidential in a case or cases when the interest of justice so requires.

And by adding Section 11.7 to read as follows:

11.7 DISCLOSURE OF GRAND JUROR'S NAMES AND QUESTIONNAIRES

Lists of Grand Jurors and Grand Juror Questionnaires should not be disclosed or made available for inspection at the Clerk's Office except upon special order of the Court.

Enclosed herewith is an order signed by all four district judges amending our Jury Selection Plan. It is requested that it be submitted to the Judicial Council for its approval pursuant to 28 U.S.C. S 1863(a).

The amendment to S 11.6 modifies the plan by limiting availability for inspection of jury lists and questionnaires to those pertaining to petit jurors. Grand juror lists and questionnaires will not be available for inspection.

The juror selection plan would be further amended by addition of S 11.7 allowing inspection of grand juror lists and questionnaires only by special order of the Court.
